

C.S.I. comes to Davitt College!

Transition Year students at Davitt College, Castlebar, had the opportunity to become C.S.I. investigators and solve a real life crime on February 6th 2013. Using a number of pieces of evidence gathered from a crime scene, students were required to solve the crime. Modern techniques such as D.N.A. profiling and blood sampling were used in conjunction with the more traditional methods of finger printing and microscopic analysis. Based on analysis of the evidence gathered, the students were able to positively identify the culprit. The Forensic Science presentation provided the students with an exciting opportunity to experience an everyday use of Science in a real world situation. It proved to be an exciting and interactive educational experience, where observation and deductive reasoning combined with the science that students are learning in Davitt College, were used to solve crimes in the real world. This day was facilitated by Forensic Scientist, Ms. Alison Leck from Education Interactive, an Australian-owned company based in Sydney.

Davitt stars deliver memorable musical

Being a parent is one of the greatest challenges the human race will ever face. Guiding offspring through the formative years of life before gradually opening the door to independence is a talent that is impossible to get fully right, but we try. Martina and I are blessed with two amazing daughters and the ups and downs of family life are many and varied. We learn something new every day, but there are moments when life reaches right into your chest, clutches your heart and catches you completely by surprise. Such a moment occurred last Tuesday in the dark corner of a packed assembly hall in Castlebar. I was standing in the shadows, watching the Transition Year students from Davitt College perform the first showing of their musical "That 80¹s Show" in front of more than 400 National School students and suddenly I felt tears rolling down my cheeks. I was stunned. How could this be happening? Thankfully, it was dark and nobody could see. They¹d have presumed that I was even madder than usual.

The reason for my emotion stood on the stage at the other end of the hall. The baby girl who first wriggled in my arms 16 years previously was standing there singing like a superstar and a flood of memories sent moisture seeping from my eyes. Memories of teething, toddlerhood and tears; of sweets, Santa and school were meshing with pride, excitement and joy. Emotions were running high as the amazing show unfolded and we were all taken on a journey back to the days of Madonna, Michael Jackson, the Rubik¹s Cube, Max Headroom and the Teenage Mutant Hero Turtles.

Over the following three nights many more parents wiped tears from their cheeks as they watched their amazing offspring perform magnificently on that famous stage. "Back to the 80's" was the 30th annual musical produced by Davitt College. Like all the others, it set standards few can match. It was brilliantly produced by the tireless and tremendously talented Eamonn Mulderrig. The Kilmaine man teaches music in the school, but went above and beyond the call of duty on this occasion. The choreography by Aine Egan of Danceworld created moments that will forever live in the memory while the music of John Flatley, his colleagues and the Davitt College Orchestra brought us on a magical trip down memory lane. The story features the graduation class of William Ocean High School as they live through their final senior year and experience the fun, heartbreaks, love and loneliness of growing up. All this is set against the biggest hits of the eighties in the USA and seen through the eyes of 30-something Corey Palmer (David Gavin). Back in his days in William Ocean High, the then 17-year-old Corey (Ethan Carey) is madly in love with Tiffany Houston (Aisling Gallagher) one of the coolest girls in school. Unfortunately, Tiffany is infatuated with football star and general cool dude, Michael Feldman (Brandon Cresham). The unfolding story brings to life magical characters such as Feargal McFerrin III (Owen Higgins), Miss Brannigan (Mary Maughan), Mr Cocker (Niall Kearns), Cindy Gibson (Cherelle Geraghty), Eileen (Holly Logan), Mel and Kim (Shona Connolly and Laura Ivers), Feldman's buddies (Oran Scully, Sean Togher and Michael Flatley), Corey¹s mates (Liam Higgins and Jamie Costello and the extravagantly wonderful duo who are McFerrin's groupies (Féile Kilkenny-Rodgers and Melissa Duffy). These were just a handful of the students involved in the mammoth production as more than 60 appeared on the stage each night at different intervals in a show that exhibited all that s good about the youth of our nation. Months of dedicated preparation paid off handsomely and the standing ovations from the sold-out audiences over the three nights demonstrated what an unmitigated success the 30th edition of the Davitt College musical truly was. The fact that the musical was a huge success owes much to the co-operation of the whole school family and this was remarked upon by school principal Bernie Rowland when she addressed the audience on Friday night after the final show.

Personally, it was one of life¹s most memorable moments. Watching Aisling and her wonderful friends create such joy in the heart of their own community was something that I¹ll take to the grave. And she picked the right boy in the end too!
