Cyber Bullying is when a person is repeatedly tormented, threatened, harassed, humiliated, embarrassed or otherwise targeted by another person using text messaging, email, instant messaging or any other type of digital technology. In light of the recent events involving cyber bullying we at Davitt College, in co-operation with the Parents Association, ran an information evening for parents on Wednesday 14th November which gave an overview of the modern phenomena of cyber bullying. The information evening covered mobile phones, texting and online social media, and was delivered by Brendan Smith of the Digital Enterprise Research Institute (DERI) at NUI Galway. At Davitt College we see the need to inform parents about mobile phone and internet use and how they can be used in a negative way. Brendan Smith from NUI Galway has travelled to schools all along the west coast delivering a positive and clear message to parents on their role in Cyber -Bullying prevention. All members of the school community, teachers, parents and students need to collaborate in order to combat cyber-bullying. This information evening was an opportunity for parents to get an insight and understanding of the potential impacts of Cyber Bullying.

remaining copies of the 1916 Proclamation of the Irish Republic. The W.B. Yeats exhibition then drew the touring group to the National Library on Kildare Street. W.B. Yeats was one of the great poets of the twentieth century who has exerted a profound influence on world literature. As Dublin's longest established theatre in continuous production, The Gaiety Theatre is one of Dublin's premier venues. The students were lucky enough to partake in a guided back stage tour, behind the scene of The Gaiety Theatre. The final stop on this literary excursion was Merrion Square, one of the largest and grandest of Dublin's Georgian squares hosting the Oscar Wilde monument and the home of W.B. Yeats. It is hoped that this Literary Tour of Dublin instilled a certain level of enthusiasm and interest for the subject of English, which will be looked for in their responses to questions on the English Junior Certificate Examination Papers in June. Furthermore, this tour offered a further dimension to the study of English which will stretch far beyond the classroom walls and it is an experience that will undoubtedly remain with the students for years to come.

A group of 114 Third Year students from Davitt College embarked on a *Literary Tour of Dublin* on November 7th 2012 and were accompanied by their English teachers. The purpose of this tour was to offer the students an alternative perspective to Literature and hopefully embellish their experience of studying some of our great Irish writers, dramatists and poets who have had connections with Dublin. The Irish literary tradition is undoubtedly one of the most illustrious in the world, famous for four Nobel Prize winners and for many other writers of international renown. Such a tradition is exhibited at The Dublin Writer's Museum which the students were fortunate enough to visit. The museum showcases and celebrates the historical wealth of literary Dublin.

The students were also guided around the Campus of Trinity College, securing a visit to the Old Library to view The Book of Kells and the Long Room which houses over 200,000 of Ireland's oldest books, along with first edition manuscripts of James Joyce's *Ulysses* and *The Dubliners* and one of the few
